A message from Ruth

Sitting in the sunshine of Tuesday, with May Day less than 12 hours away, it was easy to believe that Spring had arrived. The past 48 hours have quashed the dream, the calendar might say different, but as we reach for wellies and jumpers no-one is in any doubt that we are back in winter once more.

I wonder how often our discipleship journey feels like this week? A retreat day, a week away at a Christian festival, an inspirational Christian book and we feel we are in a new season. But then comes sickness, financial hardship, tough work situations or the relentlessness of daily demands and we are left reaching for our spiritual umbrella and thermals.

I see my experience mirrored throughout the Bible, the highs of the Exodus followed by desert wanderings, or the anointing of a King followed by personal failure. Both in relation to the weather and our walk of discipleship, we can be left wondering what happened? Where did Spring go?

In our bewilderment, I believe we should take hope from the Bible narratives. The Israelites spent 40 years in the desert, but they did not remain there. Fallible Kings were replaced by THE King. The darkness of Good Friday illuminated by the light of the empty tomb.

In relation to the weather we remain perpetual optimists, every warm and dry day has us planning barbecues and wondering about a trip to the sea! How much more should our spiritual walk be characterised by hope and conviction? Pentecost, which we will celebrate in a couple of weeks, is God's seal on the promise of Easter, we are not alone, God indwells us.

As our meteorological journey to spring does not run smoothly, neither will our Christian walk. But if we fix our eyes on Jesus, surrendering ourselves daily to his

call on our lives, as surely as spring will come, so we will step by step find ourselves transformed, by God's grace, into the likeness of Christ.

Wherever you find yourself today, hold on, spring is coming!
