A message from Duncan

Fasting, silence and solitude, and immersion in scripture. All things Jesus engaged in during his wilderness preparation; and practices that mark our Lenten journey as we seek to follow his lead and grow in our life of discipleships and service.

And today we will briefly reflect on the discipline usually associated with Lent - repentance. Ash Wednesday kick starts the season with a call to penitence and repentance with the exhortation, "*Turn away from sin, and be faithful to Christ*". Our initial reaction might be that this was not a practice into which Christ entered into during his wilderness retreat on account of his sinlessness. However, his sinlessness was not guaranteed. He had to continually turn away from the possibility of sin (the first movement of repentance) and commit himself to continually orient his life towards God (the second movement). Otherwise, he would not have been fully human, and temptation - the one thing we know Christ wrestled with in the wilderness - would have been no great shakes, certainly nothing like the temptations we face.

And so repentance is another discipline we embrace during Lent. And with the other disciplines, it is all part of the preparation of the highway for God - a way for God - that his glory might be revealed in our lives and our church (Isaiah 40). It is also a preparation for us to share in that glory revealed through works of service. Paul writes to Timothy using the illustration of pots for honourable and dishonourable use in a house. *"If anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonourable, he will be a vessel for honourable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work" (1 Tim 2.21).* We put our mind to repentance so we might be prepared to be useful to the master, that we might be ready for what he would have us do, in our lives and in our



church. Who knows what we might miss out on when we remain unprepared? Who knows what God might do amongst us if he finds us fit and ready?

God be with you all as you continue to journey with him,
