#### A message from Duncan

In our mini-series on Lenten disciplines that help us to draw nearer to God and his vision of what it is to be truly human, I come to one that makes me more nervous to discuss than any of the others: giving. In our contemporary culture our financial activities are seen as fiercely private and so we are tempted to speak of it in hushed tones as if speaking of something sacred. And that is deeply concerning. Perhaps I overstate it but I am sure you recognise something of this to one degree or another. Many suspect that money is the big issue of our generation, and I think they're probably right.

And it is deeply concerning because it is deeply spiritual. Jesus tells us, "You cannot serve both God and Money" (Mathew 6.24). 'Serve' carries both a positive and negative meaning. The positive is 'to yield obedience', the negative is spoken of those who become 'slaves to some base power, to yield to, give one's self up to.' Do we give ourselves up to God or to money? If you listen to leaders in governments across the world, including our own, it is easy to identify which it is. And the church can become deeply affected by the context in which it lives. We are always in danger of becoming entrapped by the gods of our age, just like every generation of God's people.

But the precious discipline of giving weakens the ties of that slavery and releases the blessing of God in our lives and our churches. Jesus teaches that we are rewarded by our Father in heaven when we give financially (Matthew 6). In Acts 20.35 Paul quotes Jesus when he says: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' Giving money does us good!

Many of you, I know, can testify to this truth. It was a joy to see evidence of this in our APCM financial reports. And I know that your generosity extends far beyond the church. So, this Lent, lets lean into the call we have received in Christ to imitate God in living with a spirit of generosity, knowing that "he who

supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and ... your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God." (2 Corinthians 9.10-11)
