#### A message from Margaret

We have learned that Pope Francis was a man wanting to live out his faith in humility and simplicity. His worldly possessions consisted only of a few books and records (he loved the Tango); his coffin was to be simple, not elevated for the lying-in-state; he was to be buried not in the Vatican but in among the people of Rome; his gravestone should just have one word on it "Franciscus" – not his title, nor his birth name, but that of his role model St Francis of Assisi, a man who turned his back on worldly wealth.

And then there was the striking photo of Zelensky and Trump sitting eye-to-eye, dwarfed by the magnificent roof of the Basilica, in the House of God, away from the shouting and power imbalance of the Oval Office. The Observer printed the picture with the words "The Pope's Last Act" where perhaps they lived out his injunction to "Build bridges and not walls."

But the Pope was criticised by members of his own flock for some of his reforms: clergy who lost their anticipated Vatican appointments to the laity, many of them women; the forbidding of the Mass in Latin; he certainly offended the Vatican Gardens tour guide I met, who, when showing us the helicopter pad announced with disdain "But THIS pope, he does not use it" with the implication that he was demeaning the privileges of his role. To go against what others expected, to challenge and sometimes offend the religious people of the day, to speak Truth to Power – these are all reminiscent of the Master he followed and we proclaim – Jesus, Son of God.

On a retirement retreat, we were asked to consider what our own obituary might be. What would we want it to say? Do our lives reflect this? If you have a spare 5 minutes I encourage you to have a go. It's not as morbid as it sounds! I don't think any of us are famous enough to have a gravestone with only one word to sum up our life, nor powerful enough to have world leaders come to our

departure but we can ask God to guide us in His service, to be challenged to love and stretched to widen our vision to give dignity to all, and, in the coming week to "build bridges and not walls."


