A message from Derek



But now, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. Isaiah 64:8

Handmade pots excite me! Just picking up a piece of pottery in a shop or exhibition, there's the thrill of meeting the potter via his finger marks. My experience of potting was a pottery evening class that I took in my first year of teaching. Greatly therapeutic after a day in the classroom.

My first effort is pictured here, two thumb pots joined to make a pig (dated 6th October '69!). Life filled up a bit after that but that course has given me a lasting appreciation of a potter's craftsmanship: holding handmade pots, feeling the potter's hands working the clay . . . the potter's focused attention . . . being in touch with the potter's personality and the process of making.

Genesis 2:7 tells us of our origins: the Lord God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living creature. We too are clay, and in relationship with God we become

something more: we are the work of His hand, a uniquely worked piece of craftsmanship which is being transformed by the Potter Himself. As Paul says in Ephesians 2v10: we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

So for all of us whether we feel buoyant and hopeful or are experiencing the rigours of harsh days . . . or something in between, we can pray in trust:

The Lord will fulfil his purpose for me; your steadfast love, O Lord, endures forever. Do not forsake the work of your hands. Ps.138:8

Thank you for praying for Paul Murrell's text analysis workshop in Yaoundé, which has been both encouraging and challenging so far.

Last week, one participant lost his father, and a teacher had to step back due to her child's school issues. At the weekend, three participants were in hospital—two from a motorbike accident just before they travelled to Cameroon and one with a likely case of malaria. They were all feeling the strain, but were also seeing technical breakthroughs—one translator spotted a key issue in their New Testament draft, which they still have time to fix before it is published.

This week things seem to have been going more smoothly, and the participants are settling into the routine of the workshop and applying themselves to learning as much as they can.

Please keep praying:

- for healing and comfort for those who are sick or grieving
- for peace for the teacher and her family

• for each team to have significant "lightbulb" moments in the coming days as they see ways their translations can be improved.
