A message from John

This Sunday will be the Fourth Sunday of Easter.

In Acts chapter 1 verse 3, we learn that Jesus spent forty days with the eleven Apostles between his resurrection and his ascension: "After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God."

So as we approach the fourth Sunday of Easter, we are still well within the forty days of Jesus appearing to the Apostles & teaching them. I find myself itching to know what Jesus said to the eleven during this time! Oh, to have been the proverbial "fly on the wall"! But Luke gives us very little detail, other than that Jesus "spoke about the kingdom of God" during these forty days.

Despite this amazing time with the risen Jesus, the Apostles still get things wrong! In verses 4 - 6, we learn about one standout occasion where Jesus commands the Apostles to stay in Jerusalem and to wait for God to send his Holy Spirit. What an amazing promise! But their immediate reaction is to blurt out, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

The eleven knew that the Father had sent Jesus, and yet they still did not understand the sort of kingdom that Jesus had come to create. It seems incredible to us (because we have the benefit of 2,000 years of hindsight) that they were still thinking post-Resurrection in very self-centred, human terms about the sort of kingdom which Jesus meant! Jesus has to be quite curt with them in verse seven, but then he follows up with a wonderful promise "8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you;"

Then comes the truly shocking news "and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." I bet the Apostles never saw that one coming!

As we continue to respond to the message of Easter, let us be mindful of how, and also where, we are called to be witnesses to Jesus? Where is our 'Jerusalem', our 'Judea' and our 'Samaria'... or even beyond?


