A message from Steve

I often reflect on a favourite quotation, from an Eastern Orthodox monk, Paisios: looking on at the state of the world, and church, he said:

"What I see around me would drive me insane, if I did not know that, whatever happens, God will have the last word!"

Daily hearing news, from Gaza, Ukraine, even from this country - and, to be honest, reflecting sometimes on the state of my own life - it is easy to feel discouraged, fearful for the future: 'What is the world coming to?', we may ask. But Paisios is right: God will have the last word; the 'hope' we have is not just 'fingers-crossed and hope for the best', it is a 'sure and certain' hope. 'Christ is risen: He is risen indeed' is our Easter-cry; and in Christ's Resurrection, not only is our past redeemed – our ultimate future is secured.

This is not an excuse for inaction, fatalism, passivity, an invitation to adopt a 'couldn't care less' mentality; there is much for us to *do* in our time, to commit to each day, as we work towards That Day, the great and final Day when the Last Word is spoken.

Much for us to *pray* over, too: Paisios's phrase 'the last word' reminds me of that 'last word' of our prayers – the little, powerful word 'Amen', 'so be it' - and of how the apostle Paul tells us that in Christ is God's 'Yes!', that 'that is why it is through Him that we answer 'Amen', to the praise of God'. (2 Corinthians 1:20).

From our perspective, we cannot fully understand the relation between Time and Eternity - to us, everything in one sense is 'still all to play for' as we live out our earthly lives in Time: but we can be assured that in Eternity the issue is settled: God *will* be All In All (1 Corinthians 15:22-28). Meanwhile, in the Time Between, we act, and we pray...

So, brothers and sisters! let's 'take a firm grip on the hope that is held out to us' (Hebrews 4:18); let's engage fully, prayer-fully, with the discord, the apparent chaos we sometimes see around us, and even within us - and let's have Paisios's 'last-word' confidence that our God can, and ultimately will, do abundantly more than we can ask or imagine.

For Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

Collect for the Seventh Sunday of Easter


O God the King of glory,
