Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

So we thank God for the sunshine but, as you grab a cold drink and head for some shade, thank him too that your joy in the Lord is not dependent on the weather and that you can trust God to give you His peace whatever your circumstances this week.
