A message from Jenny

At Home With God

It's a lovely thing when you visit good friends and can feel at home with them – known, loved, and able to be yourself! Jesus felt at home with His friends, Mary, Martha and Lazarus, in Bethany. And he reassures us, too, about our own future home: "In My Father's house are many rooms…! am going there to prepare a place for you" (John 14:2).

When we take time to pray, to be with God, is this not a moment to be 'at home' with Him? Yet we often struggle to be honest, and to be ourselves. There's a lovely book, 'Say It to God', by Luigi Gioia, a Benedictine monk. He encourages us to turn everything into prayer, whatever is in our lives and hearts – 'any scrap of wood is good to feed fire'. We can come as we are, because God has made Himself at home with, and even in, us: "If anyone loves me", says Jesus, "they will obey my teaching; My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them" (John 14:23).

One Lent, I was led to 'just' sit with God in quiet, to rest and to be 'at home' with Him: to be open to His loving Presence. I realised that when we are 'at home' with someone we love, words are not always necessary; just being with them is a blessing.

God wants to make His home with us, and for us to be at home in Him. Amazing! We can sometimes feel so small – or unworthy of God's loving hospitality, but there's a lovely image in Psalm 84:3 which speaks to this:

Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest for herself,

where she may have her young – a place near Your Altar.

Take courage, and find that place near Him.

'I found in Him a resting-place And He has made me glad'

(H.Bonar, from the hymn 'I heard the voice of Jesus say...')

one God, now and for ever.




Looking further ahead
