A message from Margaret

What happened to Jonah?

Those of you in St Leonard's might be wondering what happened to Jonah, as we left him on a cliffhanger two weeks ago, but we are moving on to the Apostle Paul's journeys on Sunday (Ok maybe it's just me!) At the end of Chapter 3 Jonah has told the people of Nineveh to repent of their evil ways, they have repented and God has forgiven them.

You might think it should be party time - that Jonah should be happy. But he's not. He's very angry that God has forgiven them. Jonah thought the people of Nineveh were not worth saving and deserved their fate. However, by way of a vine tree, a worm and a scorching east wind (go read chapter 4 for the full details) God shows Jonah that if he can care for the fate of a single vine tree how much more God cares for the lives of 120,000 people and their animals.

God is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in mercy. That message flows through the scriptures. (eg: Exodus 34:6, 2 Chronicles 30:9, Psalms 86, and 145, Joel 2). And if he cared about 120,000 Ninevites, how much more he cares about everyone else as well. So much that Jesus came and died to provide a way to forgiveness for all and a restored relationship with Him.

But what about us? What do we think about people who have done evil things? People who have hurt us badly or abused others. Do they deserve to rot in hell? Should they be excluded because of their past? Do we refuse to welcome some people in our church because of what they have done, even those who repent and turn to God?

As Jonah found, it's not easy being as compassionate with others as God is with us. All of us are sinners but the Good News is that all who ask are forgiven by God. And God is pro-active. He seeks us out like the shepherd after his lost sheep, like the father of the prodigal son. His love for us is beyond understanding.

The message of Jonah is that God loves everyone, even wicked people and that no-one is beyond the compassion and saving grace of God.

Do you need to hear this message for yourself, are there things you think cannot be forgiven?

Or is there anyone in your life that you could be more compassionate to this week?

Church Lighting – Notice of Church Access Restrictions

The PCC has approved work to replace the existing church lighting with new LED lighting. Details of the new lighting are on display at the back of church and the following are links to those documents to read in your own time.

- Church Lighting Overview (Plan Statement)

- Explanatory Notes for the Diagram (Diagram Key)

This work is planned to start on 8th Sept and the contractor has asked us to limit access to the church for 6 weeks.

This means that between 8th Sept and 17th Oct there will be no access to the inside of the church from 8am on Monday morning to 5pm on Friday evening.

Access on Saturday and Sunday is not affected and all our Sunday service will continue in church as normal.

Access to the bell tower through the porch has been agreed so belling ringing practice can continue on a Monday evening and a visiting team are ringing on the morning of 18th Sept.

Alternative arrangements are being made for Bump to One and Warm Welcome Wednesday to use the Church Hall during those weeks. Cleaning teams will not be able to get into the church mid-week during those weeks and we might need to arrange a one-off clean once the work is finished.
