A message from Duncan

"The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing.

He makes me lie down in green pastures,
he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul.

He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake." (Psalm 23)

But a few days remain of the month of August, then September will be upon us. At this time of the year the echoes of childhood sometimes return to us old sensations of unknown new beginnings ahead: new schools, new classes, new academic year, a new pencil case. Most of us do enjoy a quieter August, particularly on the roads, and have had an opportunity for rest and a slower pace of life, and now normal routine is just around the corner.

How do we feel about that? Eager anticipation, dread, nervous unease, excitement, reluctant acceptance? Perhaps a mix of all these. A new start after a break can be a challenge for all of us. Will we have the energy to face an uptick in activity? Will we meet the requirements of our responsibilities and the expectations of those around us once again? What challenges will I face and will I be able to face them?

Having stepped out of my normal routine for three months I am obviously feeling these things more than usual. I have been able to lie down in green pastures and paused by still waters, and now there is a path ahead. It's an untrodden path. It is for each of us. We have never trekked September 2025 before. It may look very similar to past paths, with familiar views and topography, but in reality we have

never walked it before. And the thing is, we don't have to walk it as we have before, or take the same route. Perhaps I could listen more keenly for the voice of the one who promises to "guide me along right paths for his name's sake" and trust what I hear. Perhaps we could together. And who knows where that will take us.
