#### **SEPTEMBER**

This month gets its name from being the seventh month in the Roman calendar. In the Bible the number seven is seen as a sign of completion or perfection: God made the world in six days and rested on the seventh, He chose seven stems on the lampstands in the tabernacle, there were seven churches in the book of Revelation. Seven 'I am' statements by Jesus. Can you think of some others?

The number seven also figures large in His created world – there are seven colours in the rainbow, seven notes in a musical scale, seven days in a week, seven visible heavenly bodies. Fascinating.

I have to confess that September is also my favourite month for several reasons. It's my birthday month, the weather is often crisp in the mornings and warm and sunny in the day (OK not this week...!) and there is that feeling of starting afresh, new classes or schools, new notebooks full of possibilities and blank pages to be filled.
