### A message from Duncan

I hope I didn't lay things on a little thick last Sunday!

We began our new sermon series on the list in 2 Peter 1 of qualities we are encouraged to add to our faith. It is a great list: *goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, mutual affection and love.* According to St.Peter, if we abound in these virtues our churches will be fruitful and effective in our kingdom work. Read the chapter again to see how keen Peter is that we don't miss this wisdom! He calls us to 'make every effort' to see these things increasingly added to our faith.

But it is an already very busy term ahead, with many calls on our time and focus, and expectations from employers that this is the most productive part of the year. For the vicar to be banging on about more things to add to our burdens may seem a bit rich! And to underline Peter's call to put a bit of effort in the final straw!

However, I sometimes wonder whether piling more onto our to-do list is not the effort required as much as choosing what to subtract from the list. Somehow we have to make space in our lives for that which will be truly transformative. The problem is that stuff still needs to get done in life. That part of the Martha and Mary scenario (Luke 10:38-42) has never been solved for me. But perhaps we could start with Church life. I know that's a ridiculous thing to say and I've no idea how that might be possible. But what if our Christian communities could be ones where there is *space* added to our lives rather than demands? Space for the presence of God to restore and transform us, that through the grace of God we

might become a people who are fruitful and effective. Ironically, it will take effort. But it could make all the difference.

We are continuing to pause families@4 this whilst we discern the appropriate way ahead for this service. The service was originally set up during the pandemic and we are in need of wisdom as to the most helpful way to move forward. We will be providing opportunity for feedback from families to help with this process. Meanwhile, we are endeavouring to provide Sparklers on

the second Sunday of the month during our morning services. Please continue to pray for our precious families and our ministry with them.

### Children during our services

Whilst the lighting is being installed we will not have access to the creche room during the service. Our use of the main church space may also require some adjustment to our usual routine. This may affect families in particular so please be aware of the following points:

- Please could we restrict the mats for babies and toddlers as the creche room is not available for them.
- Be aware that access to the toys will also be very limited.

 Older children can sit with parents or carers for the first part of the service which we will keep brief and appropriate for children before providing age appropriate teaching in Sparklers. (Sparklers on the first three Sundays of the month. The fourth Sunday will continue to be appropriate for all ages.)

Following the installation of the lights we will be discussing with parents to discern the best way forward in encouraging the fullest integration during our all age times.
