### A message from Duncan

We have a new Archbishop! Dame Sarah Mullaly will be 106th Archbishop of Canterbury since Saint Augustine arrived in Kent from Rome in 597. She will also be the first woman to hold the office in that long history. She will be installed as Archbishop in March of next year.

I wonder if you have read the headlines from various news outlets: "The new Archbishop will oversee the end of the church unless she..."; "The next Archbishop of Canterbury has no time to waste in making change", or my particular favourite: "What the new Archbishop must do to save the Church". It is true that she is walking into a job very few of us would wish to have. It is also true she will face severe challenges. She already knows too well that news of her appointment has been welcomed by some, but not all; and the divisions in our global communion have been writ large in the media once again.

One thing, however, of which I am sure, and contrary to the headlines, is that it is not in the Archbishop's job description to save the church! Not only is that far too great a weight to place on any one person, but the job is already taken. Jesus is the Saviour and builder of the church. Jesus says to Peter "on this rock I will build my church and the gates of hades will not overcome it." (Matt 16) The rock on which he builds is the declaration that he is God's "Messiah, the Son of the living God". When Peter declares this boldly he lives up to his name as "Petra - the rock". When he doubts the cross-shaped wisdom of God, as he does in only a few verses later, he becomes a hindrance to the Kingdom purposes of God (16.23).

If the Church of England is to continue as a small expression of God's eternal church it will depend on our conviction and our proclamation of Jesus as the answer to the problems of this world; and that the strange wisdom of the cross is

God's way of renewing, not just Britain, as those at the Labour party conference recently resolved to do, but everything.

So whatever your reactions to the appointment of Dame Sarah as our new Archbishop, please join me in praying she will believe in her heart, and boldly declare, that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the Living God, and that true, flourishing, eternal life is found at the foot of the cross and an empty tomb.


