A message from Duncan

Last Sunday I finished my sermon over at St.Peters with Eugene Peterson's paraphrase of Matthew 11.28-30.

"Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion?

Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life.

I'll show you how to take a real rest.

Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it.

Learn the unforced rhythms of grace.

I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you.

Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly."

I had forgotten how much I love this. It is a paraphrase of the scripture not a translation, but it is deeply helpful. It reminds us how religion can be such an ill-fitting weight if we mishandle things. I'm sure Eugene's use of the word 'religion' was taking a cue from Christ's words to the Pharisees and the unnecessary burdens they placed on people.

I really hope and pray that belonging to St.Leonard's or St.Peter's doesn't feel like that, though I know it sometimes will, almost inevitably. I really hope your Christian life doesn't feel like this, but for nearly all of us, it does from time to time. Sometimes we expect too much of ourselves. Sometimes we expect too much of each other. Sometimes the vicar makes poor decisions and that affects everyone else. Sometimes we take on more than we were meant. We misidentify the work the Lord calls us to join him in and become preoccupied with the things we think are important instead. These are burdens we were never meant to carry.

Jesus says if we keep company with him we will learn to live freely and lightly. "for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light". I am so far from learning these unforced rhythms of grace but I want to foreground this vision in my life, this calling of Jesus, as often as I can. Stick it to fridge; post-it note to the computer screen; bluetack it to the inside of the front door, pray it into my heart.

And if we learn these rhythms of grace together, as a community of Jesus-loving disciples, maybe it will feel like dancing. ('Steady on vicar, we're Anglicans!')



Initial reactions from those who have seen the book are very favourable and we hope to be able to distribute copies by early December.
