A message from Derek



"Wherever he steps, whatever he touches, whatever he leaves, even unconsciously, will serve as a silent witness against him. Not only his fingerprints or his footprints, but his hair, the fibres from his clothes, the glass he breaks, the tool mark he leaves, the paint he scratches . . . All of these and more, bear mute witness against him."

This is a summary of the 'Locard's Exchange Principle'. Dr. Edmond Locard was a French criminologist, who became known as the "Sherlock Holmes of France". He formulated the basic principle of forensic science: "Every contact leaves a trace". Locard proposed that it is a fundamental concept that when two surfaces come into contact, there is an exchange of material between them.

And so we have the threads of detection as followed in the plot of any our favourite TV crime series.

And so too, as we walk our days with Jesus, we find another 'exchange principle' in action. It is the 'Salt – Light Principle' of Mathew 5:13 – 16:

"You are the salt of the earth . . . You are the light of the world . . . let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

I wonder if I have become numb to Jesus' words on the significance of my daily interactions? Have these verses become just too familiar? Through my life I have been the better for the daily contacts of family, a teacher, friends, youth leaders, colleagues whose have been Jesus' salt and light to me. All such contacts have left their Jesus trace in my life.

Jesus' words are direct and plain. We <u>are</u> salt, we <u>are</u> light. Perhaps I need to have confidence in the fact that whether intended or not, I have potential to leave a 'Jesus touch exchange' in my daily contacts.

My grandfather would continually quote some lines which might seem trivial and perhaps, on first hearing, cloyey and maudlin – but, on reflection, are profound:

Little deed of kindness,

Little deeds of love

Make this world an Eden like the Heaven above.




Services and Events during Advent and Christmas
