A message from Duncan

Advent is a solemn season of penitence and fasting. That is why it shares the liturgical colour of Lent. In the words of an Advent collect, we engage in a *serious* seeking after God, and an affectionate walking with him. It is a season of waiting and longing. We allow our hearts to ache for Christ's return and the putting right of all things.

It is not easy to hold onto this within our culture today. Our advent calendars increasingly encourage us to abandon the valuable virtues of restraint, patience and frugal simplicity as increasingly exotic and luxurious treats lie behind the advent door each day. It is also highly likely that many of us will have had several Christmas lunches before Christmas day. It may seem to be all feasting and celebration with little time to pause and prepare. In the life of the church we have engaged in this tendency to pass over Advent swiftly and move on to Christmas over the last 50 years or so. And I think this is for the good reason of meeting the community where they are so we can share the good news of the incarnation, God with us. For this reason I am not about to abandon all carol services before 17th December!

However, as much of a challenge it is in this busy time, let's not forget to pause to reflect on the return of Jesus to judge the 'quick and the dead' and usher in the 'renewal of all things'. It should move us to examine our hearts and our lives, to rekindle our hope, and to renew the ache of longing for the time when, at last, we will see Jesus, not through a glass dimly, but face to face.

Keep us, O Lord, While we wait on this earth. In a serious seeking after you,
And in an affectionate walking with you,
Every day of our lives;
That when you come, we may be found
Not hiding our talent, nor serving the flesh,
Nor yet asleep with our lamp unfurnished,
But waiting and longing for our Lord,
Our glorious God for ever. Amen.

give us grace to cast away the works of darkness
and to put on the armour of light,
now in the time of this mortal life,
in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility;
that on the last day,

It might particularly appeal to young people, but will have something for everyone. Again, a wonderful opportunity to invite neighbours and friends to hear of the wonderful love of God writ large in the gift of Jesus for us all. And it all begins with a quiet, traditional, candlelit **Advent Service** in the evening on Advent Sunday. Come Lord Jesus.
