Advent Devotion for today



Numbers 12.3

"Now the man Moses was a quietly humble man, more so than anyone living on Earth."

Moses

Moses was an incredible servant of God. On his death it was said of him, 'There has never again been a prophet in Israel like Moses.' (Deuteronomy 34.10). In God's great story of salvation he was used in the great battle of Yahweh against the gods of Egypt, led the Hebrew nation through the Red Sea in that nation

defining moment, ascended Sinai into the heaven of heavens, basking in the glory of God, such that he had to cover his face with a veil.

Yet, he was known also as the most humble person on earth.

The use of this phrase, and the lessons we might learn from the context of Numbers 12 is worth pondering, as well as Moses' life more broadly. For it seems humility was not something he possessed in younger years. It developed over time.

How might we grow in humility this Advent? What helps develop a humble heart? For true humility lies at the heart of following Jesus. God promised to Moses that he would: "raise up for (his people) a prophet like you" (Deut 18.18), and with first Advent of Jesus he did just that. The one who sustains all things by the power of his word left us one direct self description: "I am gentle and humble in heart" (Matt 11.28).

Dear Lord,

Help us to embrace a humility like Christ's this Advent, as did your servant Moses. As we are increasingly caught up in the noise and busyness of celebrations and events in our community, may we also find time and space to simply pray: Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Amen.
