I was reading a book recently which suggested that decorations traditionally would be kept in the home until Candlemas - February 2nd. So you have plenty of time!

The New Year does, however, beckon us. There is plenty of time and many opportunities before us as we seek to walk with Jesus through life. It is a useful practice to take time to prepare our hearts somehow for what may lie ahead. Perhaps find a few hours, or a particularly long walk, to pray about the year: sharing with the Lord the concerns that we have, the hopes and dreams, and the challenges coming up. And most of all spend some of the time waiting on the Lord in quietness. What does he desire for us or for those around us? What areas of our lives does he think we should address in our lives? What is his agenda for us in 2026? Says the Psalmist: *For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him...pour out your heart before him* (Psalm 62.5&8)

It may be that some of our regular chores and routines have to continue, but even consciously setting aside a day to avoid the noise of everyday, turning off the notifications from our phone (or the phone completely!), and simply saying "*Lord, your servant is listening*", can open us to the Divine voice *guiding us on right paths for his name's sake*. And whether there be dark valleys or green pastures ahead, we can be confident that goodness and mercy will pursue us every day of the year, and forever.
