Our time

Unless you are existing in a media free zone, it cannot have escaped you that we are currently living in more dangerous and unpredictable times than many of us have known. Maybe you feel like giving up reading the paper or social media and hiding under the duvet?

What do we say when people talk about Trump at work, in the streets, amongst friends? What is our Christian response to this? Many people much more learned than me will have their own advice. Mine is simply this:

1. Pray more. God is sovereign and answers our prayers. Pray for those you see on the news, for those being arrested by ICE and for those bravely standing up for their neighbours. Pray for Greenlanders, pray for those in Venezuela, and in Ukraine all waiting for peace. Pray especially for wisdom for politicians and leaders of all countries to seek peace and justice and the good of all.
2. Worry less. We don't get to choose what time we live in, but God has his hand on our lives and he is faithful to be with us throughout life. If we trust him, it doesn't mean everything will turn out perfectly (it probably won't), but he has promised to be with us always.

3. Do just one thing... if you feel helpless about world events it can seem like you are powerless to do anything, but that is not true. Maybe we cannot change the world, but each of us can potentially change at least one person's life for the better today. A smile, a hug, a kind word or deed, a prayer, sympathy, a cup of tea offered, or a listening ear. What will you do?


